

## How we can serve our members


- Chaplains can help fill that gap for the unchurched.






#### **BEING A CHAPLAIN**



# **Important Topics**

## > DEEP WOUNDS

Combat and traumatic events can sear painful images in the deepest recesses of a soul like ancient hieroglyphics etched on the walls of hidden underground caverns. Unlike hieroglyphics, which only record historical events, the painful memories of a soul struggle for discovery. The battle deep within rises to the surface and disrupts life the way an earthquake deep within the earth's crust shakes the surface. You don't see the earthquake but the evidence manifests from a few broken dishes that fall from a shelf to homes left in piles of rubble. Often, the wounded and their loved ones cannot see the pain carried, only the evidence from disruptive behavior.

For some, a traumatic event can result in Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). When an ethical or moral principle is violated in the transaction of a traumatic event, the result can also produce moral injury. Moral injury can happen when an individual is personally responsible for a traumatic event or associated with one in authority who was responsible. On the surface, moral injury symptoms can look like PTSD. However, when a person has a moral injury they experience the added components of guilt and shame.

Paul's third missionary journey

Paul's third writes Ephesians

#### AUTHOR, DATE, AND RECIPIENTS

The apostle Paul wrote this letter to the churches in Ephesus and the surrounding region c. A.D. 62 while imprisoned in Rome (Acts 28). During this time he also wrote Colossians and Philemon. All three letters were sent with Tychicus and Onesimus.

#### THEME

There are three main themes of Ephesians: (1) Christ has reconciled all creation to himself and to God; (2) Christ has united people from all nations to himself and to one another in his church; and (3) Christians must live as new people.

#### PURPOSE

Ephesians offers general instruction in the truths of God's redemptive work in Christ; the unity of the church among diverse peoples; and proper conduct in the church, the home, and the world.

#### KEY THEMES

- 1. All people are by nature spiritually dead. They disobey God's law and are ruled by Satan (1:7; 2:1-3, 5, 11-12).
- 2. God predestined his people to redemption and holiness in Christ (1:3-14; 2:4, 8-9).
- 3. God's rich mercy in Christ has saved sinners. This free gift is by grace through faith alone (1:7-8; 2:4-14).
- 4. Jesus' saving work was part of redeeming a fallen creation for God. For this he deserves glory, honor, and authority in this age and the next (1:15-23; 3:1-13).
- 5. Jesus unites Jews and Gentiles into his one body, the church, as a new creation (1:23; 2:10-22; 3:1-21; 4:1-6).

6:1-10 Paul illustrates a life of love in the Spirit, and ambiovoid

**6:1** you who are spiritual. This does not refer to an elite class of Christians. It describes mature and experienced Christians. They are able to help their troubled brother or sister.

**6:2** and so fulfill the law of Christ. In a broad sense this means the entire body of ethical teaching that Jesus gave and endorsed (see note on 1 Cor. 9:21). In a specific sense it probably refers to the command to love one's neighbor as oneself (Matt. 22:39; John 13:34).

**6:7–8** whatever one sows, that will he also reap. Paul's reference to "reaping" has in view the blessings of eternal life that belong to the believer as the result of "sowing" his life to the Spirit.

**6:10** While believers await their rewards (vv. 7-9) they should **do good**. The primary focus should be on serving other believers, but not to the exclusion of people outside the church.

6:15 On Christians as a new creation, see 2 Cor. 5:17.

**6:16** Israel of God. In contrast to the children of the "present Jerusalem" (4:25), the true people of God are the *believing* children of Abraham (3:7, 29). They belong to "Jerusalem above" (4:26–27).

**6:17** The false teachers, and perhaps some of the Galatian Christians, have been misrepresenting Paul. Paul insists on the respect that is due his ministry. He is a genuine minister of Christ and has the scars to prove it—what he calls **the marks of Jesus** that resulted from his being persecuted (see 2 Cor. 11:23-27).

**6:18** Paul's final prayerful blessing shows that he has not given up on the Galatians. He still refers to them as **brothers** and calls on Christ to give them grace.
